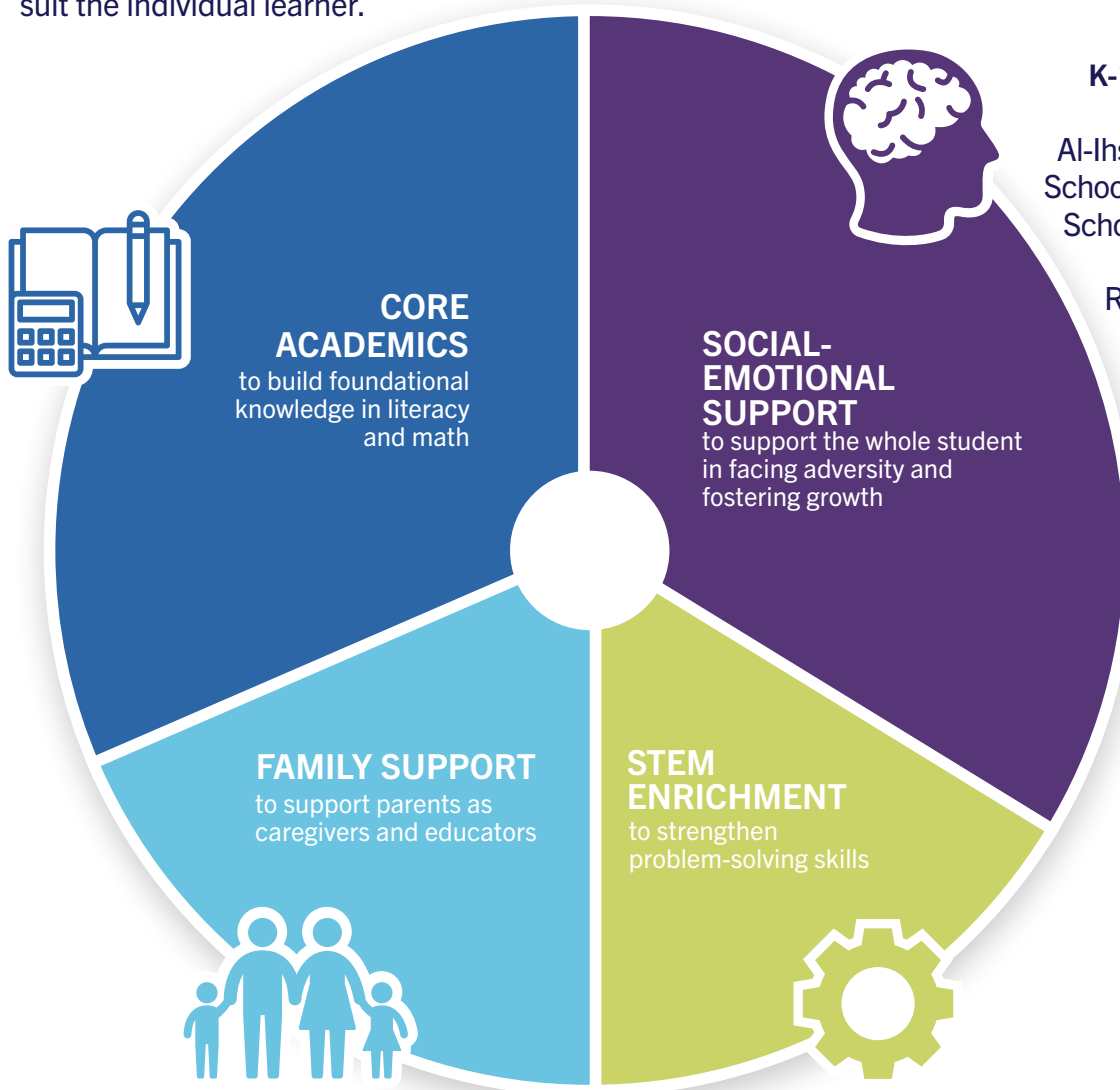

Core Academics

Students will develop the tools and confidence to grapple with grade-level math and literacy skills using familiar and new strategies.



Social-Emotional Support

Teachers will lead students through activities that identify and foster healthy habits.



STEM Enrichment

K-2 students will follow along with at-home science activities that spark imagination and creativity. Students in grades 3+ will use STEM software to practice coding and building a robot.



Family Support

All parents of students enrolled in Extended Learning Day programming are invited to attend free virtual parent workshops. These focus on timely and relevant topics like 'Digital Citizenship' and 'Parenting Through Adversity'.
